FOR FIRST-YEAR & RUNNING START STUDENTS

DID YOU KNOW...

Students who live on campus are more likely to graduate, have a higher GPA, maintain closer contact with faculty, and have higher levels of self-confidence and self-esteem?

Central Washington University is a residential campus and has a residence hall live-in requirement. If you are single, a first-year student enrolled in seven college credits or more, under the age of 20, and not planning to live locally with a parent or direct relative,

you must live in a CWU residence hall, regardless of the number of college credits you have earned. Running Start students, regardless of class standing, are also required to live on campus for one year.
