What Will They Do With The Information?

From utilizing confidential resources to reporting to the University or law enforcement, you have choices about where to seek assistance, as well as what, where, and when to report, if you choose to do so.

- The resources listed in this brochure are divided into categories based on whether they are confidential or private
- Each CWU campus will have varied local resources depending on the location

Anyone seeking assistance, whether for themselves or someone they are concerned about, is strongly encouraged to contact a confidential resource first.

Confidential resources can be a good starting point for individuals seeking information or support because they can outline the various reporting options and resources available, without the responsibility to report the incident to the Title IX Coordinator or law enforcement.

What is Sexual Misconduct?

At CWU, all forms of sexual misconduct are prohibited.

Sexual misconduct is a broad term that includes acts of:

- Sexual violence/assault
- Sexual harassment
- Sexual exploitation
- Dating violence
- Domestic violence
- Stalking

- Dedicated to sensitive response to crime, such as victim advocate response and support
- Explains options and pursues remedies and resolutions. including safety planning
- Conducts investigation when you file a criminal complaint

All professional CWU faculty and staff, as well as designated student employees

Duty to respond to and report sexual misconduct at CWU

- Respect student and employee privacy

- Reports relevant information to appropriate University campus partner
- Takes required action in situations of acute threat to individual or community safety
- · Shares information as needed, but confidentiality is not guaranteed

Responsible Employees

• Offers support and directs to campus resources

- Required to report information to the Title IX Coordinator
- Does not investigate
