Articulation Agreement

Spokane Falls Community College Associate in Fine Arts (AFA) in Music Program &

Central Washington University
Bachelor of Music in Performance (BM)
Bachelor of Music in Education (BM)
Bachelor of Music in Composition (BM)
Bachelor of Arts (BA) in Music

Purpose

This articulation agreement is for students who have earned an AFA in Music from Spokane Falls Community College (SFCC) and will complete the remainder of required course work at Central Washington University (CWU) to earn a BM or BA in Music.

Students with an AFA in Music from SFCC will be eligible for enrollment in the BM or BA in Music programs at CWU. CWU accepts up to 105 community college credits to go towards a completed bachelors degree at CWU.

The technical content of the music program at SFCC is a viable match for the CWU program. The CWU faculty and advisors are experienced in advising for student success. As such, this agreement meets the needs of SFCC students in an efficient manner.

Articulation Duration and Review

This agreement shall begin the first day of September 2023 and extend until the last day of June 2028.

Both SFCC's program in Music and CWU's program in Music will designate a minimum of one faculty member per program to oversee the currency, accuracy, and efficiency of this articulation agreement. The appropriate representatives of SFCC and CWU shall review this agreement at the completion of each academic year. Amendments may be required and are allowed to maintain a functional relationship of the articulation agreement.

If either school chooses to discontinue the agreement, written notice should be provided 180 days prior to the date of discontinuation. In the event of discontinuation, CWU will continue to honor the terms of this agreement for students who meet all of the following requirements:

- The student has begun the AFA at SFCC prior to the notice of discontinuation and will complete the AFA within 2 years of the discontinuation of this agreement.
- The student has identified CWU as a transfer destination.

Agreement Guidelines

Students who complete the AFA in Music at SFCC, who are admitted to CWU, and who successfully audition on their applied instrument for admission to the CWU Music Program,

enter CWU with the following:

- Up to 39 MUS credit hours toward degree completion in Music.
- The equivalent of 6 quarters of large ensemble credits. This includes Band, Orchestra and Choir. Small ensembles do not count in this requirement.
- Up to 6 credits of applied instruction. The number of quarters of instructions that this equates will be determined by evaluation done by the CWU applied professor aligned with the transferring lessons.

A detailed breakdown of transfer course/credit equivalencies and a sample plan is included in Appendices A and B. Course credits which do not have direct equivalences will be awarded as elective credits.

CWU General Admission Requirements

Students must meet all CWU application deadlines and admission requirements to participate in this agreement.

CWU Music Admission Requirements

Students must have been awarded the AFA in Music at SFCC in order to be considered for admission to the BM or BA in Music under this agreement. In addition, students must meet the following requirements:

- A successful performance audition, scheduled at CWU through the appropriate applied professor. Early auditions are recommended and may be done at any time during the 2-year program at SFCC. Prospective students will audition at CWU. Based on the audition, CWU may offer admission contingent upon the completion of the AFA degree in good academic standing which isa 3.0 or higher cumulative GPA. Admission to a specific level of study is dependent on the performance audition. Transfer students generally enroll in applied lessons at the 200 level but may move up in successive quarters with noted advancement in jury exams. A student may request initial enrollment at a higher level of applied study but must be able to demonstrate the appropriate ability in technique, repertoire and artistic delivery.
- A diagnostic theory and aural skills exam will be offered to transfer students to
 place in theory IV or higher in order to ensure the appropriate level of theory skill
 has been achieved. If necessary, students may be advised to take one or more
 theory or aural skills courses to ensure the theory knowledge and skills are at the
 appropriate level.
- A piano proficiency exam will be required for transfer students in order to ensure an appropriate level of piano proficiency has been achieved. The CWU Piano Proficiency Exam (PPE), required of all music majors with the exception of piano performance majors.

The music degree requirements at CWU adhere to NASM accreditation standards.

Evaluation of courses for transfer credit will not be bound by the terms of this agreement for students who choose to pursue a degree other than the BM or BA in Music. The transferability of courses may be determined on a course-by-course basis if the student does not earn an AFA in Music as indicated in this agreement or does not continue at CWU in the Bachelor of Music program.

CWU Undergraduate Degree Requirements

Students are expected to meet all other CWU degree and graduation requirements to be awarded a degree. CWU requires a minimum of 180 total credits with 60 credits required in upper division (300-400 level), and a minimum of 45 credits taken at CWU. Students may need to complete up to 15 credits of Foreign Language if they have had less than 2 years of high school foreign language or 1 year of college foreign language.

General Education Requirements

The SFCC AFA does not directly transfer to CWU as a Direct Transfer Agreement regarding general education requirements at CWU thus additional general education classes may need to be completed at CWU. The number of those classes will be determined by what was taken at SFCC.
