



ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

And

**Spokane Falls Community College
(Associate in Arts - DTA)**

For

Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree in Studio Art

Central Washington University (CWU) and Spokane Falls Community College hereby establish an articulation agreement leading to a Bachelor of Fine Art degree in Studio Art. The degree will be conferred by CWU.

This agreement will begin in the 2020/21 academic year. The parties to this agreement commit to offering this program until dissolved by mutual agreement. An evaluation of the program will be conducted every three years.

Students from Spokane Falls Community College will earn the Associate in Arts Direct Transfer Agreement (DTA) and will normally transfer to CWU as junior standing and automatically satisfy the General Education requirements at CWU.

Students having completed the SFCC AA-DTA degree and transferring to CWU can begin their studies directly as a **BFA-Studio Art Major** if they meet the following criteria: Have completed at least five art courses at SFCC and have a minimum cumulative grade-point average (GPA) of 3.0 or better in their art courses (see exhibit B). Students with less than a 3.0 GPA in their art courses can begin their studies directly as a **BA-Art Major**. They are eligible to apply for the BFA in Studio Art after completion of three quarters at CWU.

Upon completion of the program courses as shown in **Exhibit A** and the meeting of all graduation requirements a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in Studio Art will be awarded. Students must complete a minimum of 45 credits at CWU, 60 credits of upper division credits (300/400), a minimum total of 180 credits, one year college/university level study of a single foreign language or two years high school study of a single foreign language, achieve a cumulative grade-point average (GPA) of at least 2.0 in courses taken at CWU,

and achieve a cumulative grade-point average (GPA) of at least 2.25 in the major to graduate. **Exhibit B** provides associate degree requirements and its equivalencies.

Tuition will be billed to each student at CWU's prevailing cost-per-credit rate for all courses.

Admission requirements for CWU are as follows:

- 1) Completed CWU Application for Admission (application can be found at <http://www.cwu.edu/admissions/apply-now>).
- 2) A non-refundable \$50 application fee is required. Students submitting an application online must pay by using a credit (Visa or Mastercard) or debit card. Your application will not be processed until your \$50 application fee has been paid. Please follow the instructions at the end of the online application carefully.
- 3) Once online payment has been made, **DO NOT** close your browser. Follow the steps below.
 - a) You **MUST** click on the SUBMIT button on bottom right side of the page.
 - b) You will then be returned to the application and you must click SUBMIT on the top right side.

(If you do not submit the application after the payment is made CWU will not receive your application and it will not be processed.)
- 4) You are now ready to start the online application process. Click on the link below to select the appropriate online application.
- 5) Students transferring to CWU with the AA-DTA must have a minimum cumulative transferable grade point average of 2.0 from all colleges or universities previously attended.

All enrolled students are eligible to apply for financial aid at CWU. Each student's situation will be evaluated on an individual basis. Students must apply for financial assistance through CWU's Financial Aid Office.


