Hebeler Hall

In 1940, this Hall was built and designed for early childhood education for children in grades 1-6. There was also rooms built for a kindergarten class and a nursery with a total of 10 classrooms within the building.

The exterior brick L structure building has not been remodeled but the interior has. In the mid 1980's, it was repaired and modernized to make it more useful for instructional purposes (What is in a Name? 2022). Now this building is home to College of Humanities and Art programs.

This building was named after a inspirational women within the education program, Amanda Hebeler. From 1924 to 1956, she was the director of the teaching program, as well as a professor for the university until 1960, when she retired.

During the times she worked at the university, she was planning with the school to make a new education building. Before Hebeler Hall was built, Edison Hall held the student teaching programs. It was after she retired that the university dedicated this building to be named after her.

Hebeler Hall has a few interesting art pieces on and within the building architectural structure.

Above the doors, is a carving that represents children playing. If you look closely, you will see some pets, a dog, and a bunny. Some children are playing with a jump rope, ball, baseball, baseball bat, and some are even some telling secrets to each other.





Within the building there is a statue titled 'Affection' representing a young child, hugging a dog. This was dedicated to Clara Meisner in 1941, in memory of her being a Primary Educator to a Kindergarten class.

Both of these attractions are located on the first floor of the building.





This water fountain is the oldest one in the building. While the building interior became modernized, this fountain remained.
