The career counselors at Lynnwood and Des Moines provide the same range of services as the main campus: 1) career counseling; 2) assistance with cooperative education/internships; and 3) assistance with job search. The two counselors also teach Univ. 301 - Career Management. 173 students took this class over the past fiscal year. This year we increased the Des Moines campus counselor from 11 to 12 months

to better serve students over the summer months. The Lynnwood position is only 10 months. Major events this year included the first Sports Management event at Des Moines which will be an ongoing event there. Approximately 90 students attended this event. As well, this fall we coordinated the first College of Business fair at Des Moines. Approximately 200 students attended that event. It will also be an ongoing event. Both counselors participated in joint career fairs with Edmonds Community College and Highline Community College.
