Intramural Program Description:

The purpose of Intramural sports program at Central Washington University is to provide a comprehensive and varied program of recreational and competitive experiences designed to meet the needs and interests of students. Activities are provided in the form of leagues, tournaments, and/or special events each quarter. There is a place for everyone in the intramural sports program; most activities are designed to accommodate all individuals regardless of skill level and experience. The activities offered are based upon participant interest and the availability of resources and facilities. The activities are structured so that students, faculty or staff members, and the adult dependants of eligible participants can form lasting social bonds while meeting their physical and wellness needs.

All the programs offered over the last year have taken place at the CWU- Ellensburg campus. The Intramural sports program operates out of the Recreation Center located in the middle of campus. The staff utilizes an office space and computer work stations inside the Recreation Center Administration area to conduct the day-to-day business of the program. The leagues and tournaments offered throughout the quarter are scheduled in multiple facilities and spaces both on and off campus. Each facility is used for separate purposes and for different reasons based on the season of the year and the time of day available.

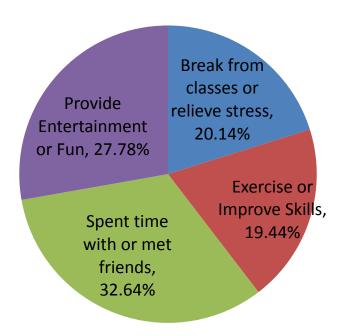
Additionally, Special Events are offered year-round to provide 1 to 2 day events that are separate from the weeks-long leagues. Examples of some of the special events offered include the Homecoming 5K, Student Appreciation Day, Discover Orientation Wildcat Snapshot Session,

Wildcat Cup, "Pig"skin Tournaments, Exam Jam, among others. For the 2010-2011 academic year approximately 2,500 participants took part in these activities.

Assessment efforts are ongoing and program participants are surveyed quarterly to ensure their experience is meaningful and relevant to their campus life. The Intramural Sports Program has set the following objectives for the 2011-2012 academic year:

- To provide leadership and learning opportunities through participation.
- To provide an inclusive environment where the benefits of sportsmanship are realized.
- To provide on-campus employment opportunities for students in a positive learning environment.
- To provide opportunities for social contacts and the development of lasting relationships.
- To provide recreation for individuals, regardless of their skill ability or experience.
- To provide opportunities which develop a positive attitude towards physical activity and which benefit personal health.
