The CWU Wildcat Marching Band is part of a rich tradition of musical excellence at Central Washington University, having performed at CWU football games during the past 65 years. The 180-member ensemble performs at all home football games, the "Battle in Seattle", and for various student rallies during the football season.

The presence of the Marching Band is integral to the football program – helping to create an atmosphere that makes competitive, intercollegiate sports an attractive, enjoyable event to attend. Approximately twenty-five thousand people will hear the CWU Marching Band during a typical football season.

The majority of the 180 member marching band consists of music education majors who learn the necessary skills to teach marching band through participating in the ensemble. So the Marching Band serves as a public-relations component of the University, an extra-curricular ensemble for athletics, and an excellent educational laboratory for our music education majors.
