Campus Activities primary audience is always the CWU Student Body with the general CWU and Ellensburg communities as secondary audiences. Campus Activities works collaboratively with a numerous

campus departments and agencies throughout the year such as: Discover/Orientation, First Year Experience, Wildcat Welcome Weekend, CWU Open House, Wildcat Day, Athletics, ASCWU, Clubs and Organizations, University Recreation, Music Department, Theater Department, among quite a few others.

Signature programming includes Monday Movie Madness with over 10,000 students and non-students in attendance. Open Mic Nights with over 2,000 students. Musicians such as Mary Lambert, Tyson Motsenbocker, Mike Edel, Raining Jane, Tyrone Wells, Eric Engerbretson...performed to over 3,000 students and families.

Throughout the year we presented a number of long-standing traditional events and activities such as Homecoming, Boo Central, Ware Fair, Family Weekend, and Student Appreciation Day. Each of those provided entertainment/activities for audiences ranging from over 500 elementary school children and their parents/families, to students, family members, alumni, faculty/staff, and community members and vendors.
