ESC has 9 active organizations and a few additional interested in becoming recognized ESC organizations. ESC organizations are: Asian University American Program (AUAP), Black Student Union (BSU), Central African Student Association (CASA), Equality Through Queers and Allies (EQUAL), LatinX Student Organization (LSO), Filipino-American Student Association (FASA), First Generation Student Organization (FGSO), Japanese Student Association (JSA), and Movimiento Estudiantil Chicanx de Aztlan (MECHA). JSA attended ESC throughout the year and became official recognized as an ESC organization during Spring Quarter. Each year, \$3,500 is allocated to organizations to help support them with programming, purchasing promotional items, and traveling to leadership conferences. ESC connects with numerous students through programs planned by the individual organizations, as well as ASCWU and Community Programmer Sponsored events.

We collect this data via a Comprehensive Calendar that all of the orgs are responsible for maintaining with their attendance logs. ESC hosted identity based graduations in the spring to honor specific celebrations including

Raices/Latinx Graduation, Lavender Graduation, Black/African American Graduation, and Filipino Graduation. The ESC organizations work together to represent multiple issues on campus and host a variety of events throughout the year creating space for students with historically marginalized identities.

Funds transfer of \$17,741 was roll back of unspent funds from first two years of funding cycle

The budget for FY23 ended with \$14,162 unspent from their allocation that year. This was primarily due to ESC organizations originally held back on utilizing their individual funds in the event that they may need to pay for the affinity group graduation celebrations with some of that funding. Administrative support and funding was not finalized until Winter Quarter, which did not leave a significant amount of time for organizations to effectively utilize those additional funds.
