The COVIC-19 Pandemic continues to offer challenges to inspiring engagement, student concerns for their safety, and large scale programming.

11. What growth or increases would you like to see in your program in the future?

ASCWU Senate would love to increase the future collaboration with individual academic colleges to develop meaningful relationships with the leadership in academic colleges (deans, chairs, etc.). Additionally, the Senate is hoping to expand processes to serve as a high functioning branch of student government.
