Allows students to experience real-world entertainment and sports broadcasting opportunities including play-by-play and show development.

2. What are your specific program goals or learning/operational objectives? How are you assessing the effectiveness of your program in achieving those targets?

The specific goal is to broadcast sports games, agreed and approved by CWU Athletics through our partnership. We assess by reviewing the total number of broadcasters, total listeners, number of games covered, and other content such as player interviews.

  - a. Are there overlaps or intersections with other university programs who have a similar purpose or service?

Provide support to CWU Athletics by providing coverage of games, expand access to a broader audience through alternative means of attending games, and provide students with hands-on experience in sports broadcasting. This year, we provided live play-by-play coverage of all home Men's and Women's Basketball games, and plan to cover some baseball and softball. Production and game preparation is also necessary for each broadcast. Regarding overlaps, CWU Athletics streams their games on their YouTube page and hired an outside entity (SWX) to cover all football and some basketball games. KCWU has specific underwriters that air within sports programming, and CWU Athletics also sold their own inventory.

4. How does your program align with the purpose of S&A funding? "Supporting cocurricular and extracurricular activities and programs participated in by students in the furtherance of their education."

Directly – the budget just pays for students to be directly involved in sports broadcasting.

Students are placed in leadership roles and have the opportunity to train other students in creative expression, professional communication skills, and engagement with people inside and outside of the department.

Students (from any major) provide the content, and is listened to by the CWU students, staff, faculty, and the Ellensburg community. All students are welcome.

Two paid student staff and eight volunteers are directly engaged with WSRN. For basketball, each game averaged 670-880 viewers and listeners.
