High School Equivalency Program

The High School Equivalency Program (HEP) is a federally funded program designed to serve migrant and seasonal farmworkers. HEP provides GED instruction, academic support, and placement services to all eligible participants.

Eligibility Requirements

A student is eligible for HEP if they meet one of the following criteria:

- They or their immediate family members have engaged in migrant or seasonal farm work for at least 75 days in the last 24 months.
- They have participated or been eligible to participate in the Workforce Investment Act 167 program (WIA 167)
- The were eligible to participate Title C Migrant Education program within the last 24 months.
- Is at least 16 years of age or over
- Is not currently enrolled in an elementary or secondary school
- Has not earned a secondary school diploma or its equivalency

Once qualified:

- HEP is free
- HEP also covers the cost of GED testing (minimum of \$150 cost)
- Provides educational materials (Books, pen, pencils, highlighters, binders, and other)

Outreach

Provide 110 students with financial assistance in the following areas:

- Provide school materials (pens, pencils, books, highlighters, erasers, etc.)
 Cover the full cost of all Pre and official GED tests (\$120 for Official tests, \$24 for pre-test in addition any retesting)
- Free Instruction
- Stipends when approved
