 - Student Behavior
 - This past weekend I was a witness to an assault perpetrated by a student against another student. This assault appeared to be motivated by the victim belonging to a group that the assailant didn't like.
 - I strongly condemn this behavior and ask that all students conduct themselves with self control and dignity.
 - New SAS Meeting will be held this Wednesday, March 9th
 - Due to correspondence with the Faculty Senate Chair, it appears that the faculty is looking to limit the role that the ASCWU can play in advocating for students, when requested to do so.
 - I have faithfully advocated for student throughout the year. In doing this it is my sincerest belief that I have set the bar for student advocacy from my office.
 - It is this new level of BOD involvement that I fear has made some faculty and administrators uncomfortable, and they may now be looking to limit the role that students play in advocating for themselves or having others advocate for them.
