**\*\*IMPORTANT! Students completing the Bachelor of Science in Public Health complete a required 10- credit internship (PUBH 490).** Most students will undertake a 400 hour internship their senior year during summer quarter. However, there are options to take internship credits during the academic year if certain criteria are met and you receive advisor and program approval. Please see your advisor about internship options.

\*Students should plan to take HED 101 within their GenEd sequence; ENG 101 & 102 must be completed prior to enrollment in PUBH 240.

Please note also that majors must earn a C or better in PUBH 230 and PUBH 240 in order to enroll in most other required core courses. PUBH 375 may be taken concurrently with PUB 230.

Pre-Nursing specialization students should be aware that specific requirements and application dates to various nursing programs may vary. Students should familiarize themselves with the specific pre-requisites and program application dates of these programs. Please stay in regular contact with our pre-nursing advisors to stay on track!

Pre-Nursing students may choose to take summer courses, reducing their academic workload during the regular academic year. Check with individual departments for course availability.

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PLEASE NOTE: **This document is meant to provide a sample and does not guarantee seat availability in a course.** Students should plan to register/enroll early to gain entry into courses. Furthermore, many of these courses are offered more than once per year so individual academic plans will vary dependent upon course and personal schedules.
