2. Transfer to the Elementary Education program at CWU with the Edmonds Community College Associate in Arts Direct Transfer Agreement (DTA). You can meet pre-admission requirements towards your bachelor's degree while completing the requirements for the DTA.
3. Students may transfer a maximum of 135 total credits from regionally accredited four-year universities, including a maximum of 105 credits from regionally accredited community colleges.

5. Work with an Edmonds Community College faculty advisor to ensure proper course sequencing for the DTA and elementary education major.

8. Apply to the School of Education Teacher Preparation Program (TPP) at CWU early in your sophomore year. Download and print TPP application at www.cwu.edu/teacher-certification. Submit completed application packet to CWU-Lynnwood.
9. Submit all official transcripts to CWU-Ellensburg. Submit a final official transcript once your DTA is posted.

3. No grade lower than a C in major, minor, or education foundation coursework.
4. Additional graduation requirements include completing all major courses with a C or better, maintain a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0, and meet all requirements of the Teacher Certification Program for Washington State Teacher Certification.
5. This major satisfies the Washington State teacher education endorsement for elementary (K-8) education (2014). There is not an option to complete this major without completing all state teacher certification requirements.
