2. Transfer to the Elementary Education program at CWU with the Highline College Associate of Arts Direct Transfer Agreement (DTA). You can meet preadmission requirements towards your bachelor's degree while completing the requirements for the DTA.
3. Students may transfer a maximum of 135 total credits from regionally accredited four-year universities, including a maximum of 105 credits from regionally accredited community colleges.

5. Work with a Highline College faculty advisor to ensure proper course sequencing for the DTA and elementary education major.
6. A minimum 3.0 GPA in the last forty-five (45) credits is required, with a minimum grade of C in admission courses.
7. Apply for admission to CWU at <https://www.cwu.edu/admissions/transfer-student>. Visit the CWU-Ellensburg campus early in your academic career to find out if you are eligible for dual admission. Find application and guidelines at <http://www.cwu.edu/admissions/dual-admission-program>.
8. Pass all sections of the Washington Educator Skills Test - Basic (WEST-B) early in your sophomore year (or provide qualifying ACT or SAT scores). Information on the WEST-B can be found at [www.west.nesinc.com](http://www.west.nesinc.com).
9. Apply to the School of Education Teacher Preparation Program (TPP) at CWU early in your sophomore year. Download and print TPP application at [www.cwu.edu/teacher-certification](http://www.cwu.edu/teacher-certification). Submit completed application packet to CWU-Des Moines.
10. Submit all official transcripts to CWU-Ellensburg. Submit a final official transcript once your DTA is posted.

4. Additional graduation requirements include completing all major courses with a C or better, maintain a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0, and meet all requirements of the Teacher Certification Program for Washington State Teacher Certification.
5. This major satisfies the Washington State teacher education endorsement for elementary (K-8) education (2014). There is not an option to complete this major without completing all state teacher certification requirements.
