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Eastside Catholic School Requirements	Central Washington University Equivalencies
<p><b>English</b> 4 years of English</p>	<p>Required: English 101 + another course in the English Department above the 100 level</p> <p><i>Students who intend to complete 11th and 12th grade English through Running Start must take English 101 and another course in the English department above the 100 level</i></p>
<p><b>Theology</b> 4 years of Theology</p>	<p>All religion courses must be taken at EC</p>
<p><b>Lab Science</b> 3 years of science (minimum 3 years of lab science, four years are recommended)</p>	<p>Any course in the following departments at the 100 level or above: Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Science, Geology, Physics</p>
<p><b>Math</b> 3 years of math (minimum Algebra 1, Algebra 2, and Geometry; four years are recommended)</p>	<p>Math: any course above the 100 level</p>
<p><b>Social Studies</b> 3 years of social studies</p>	<p>US History: History 143 and 144 Students who intend to complete the US History Requirement at CWU must take both courses listed above.</p> <p>American Government: Political Science 210 Students who intend to complete 12th grade Social Studies at CWU are required to take POSC 210</p>



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<b>World Language</b> 2 years of one world language (three years are recommended)	Please work with your EC counselor if you intend to complete the World Language requirement through CWU
<b>Fine Arts</b> 2 years of arts (minimum 1 year visual and performing arts)	Any course in the following departments at the 100 level or above: <b>Art, Dance</b> , Film, Music, <b>Theater</b>
<b>PE/Health</b> 1.5 years of physical education 0.5 years of health	If Health has not already been completed, EC will accept <b>HED 101</b> .  PE courses can be taken at CWU. Students must take two credits of PE to earn a full semester's PE credit.
<b>52 total credits</b> are required for graduation	Any courses above and beyond required courses are considered elective credits.

**Courses highlighted in yellow are not all currently 5 credits.**

- The majority of CWU Art, Dance, and Theater courses are 3 or 4 credits, so students may need to take more than one course to fulfill the required credits needed for the high school.
  - Most Music classes are 5 credits, so students are encouraged to take these courses if they interest them. FILM 250 (Intro to Film and Video Studies) is also 5 credits.
- HED 101 is 4 credits. An alternative could be NUTR 101 (Introduction to Human Nutrition), which is 5 credits.

### **POSC 210 - American Politics**

Description: Origin and development of the United States government; structure, political behavior, organizations, and processes; rights and duties of citizens.
