Identify and discuss repertoires of white-collar crime and demonstrate an understanding of their embeddedness in socioeconomic markets of exchange.		Student will write essays discussing the social architecture of illegal repertoires of misdirection, misrepresentation, circumvention, and misappropriation.	
Identify and discuss the organization's embedded relationships with peers, their rivals, their suppliers, their customers or clients, their access to capital, securities markets, and production markets.		Students will write essays discussing the relationship within the organizational field.	
Demonstrate an understanding of the relationship between principals and agents and the social functions of trust in socioeconomic exchange.		Students will write essays discussing agency theory and detail its implications for white-collar crime.	
Identify and discuss the social structural contingencies related to organizational cohesion or disintegration in political conspiracies.		Students will write essays discussing the organizational contingencies of discipline, closeness, apartness, and mediation found in the structural relations of political conspiracies.
