Students will take objective and essay tests in class where they will recognize and discuss global stratification and its social consequences.
Students will demonstrate knowledge of inequality in the US, especially social class and the institutionalization of inequality and the social and personal consequence.	Students will take objective and essay tests in class where they will recognize and discuss social class and inequality in the US.
Students will use critical thinking skills to discuss and analyze topics related to social inequality.	Students will read four books on topics related to inequality and write a critical analysis of each; students will participate in class discussions related to course material.
