You have all done a great job thus far and obtain \$37,000 in the general account for the remainder of the year. You have already allocated for the 21,000 that is split between the Orgs for the academic year.

# **Executive Board Report:**

- Chair: Spencer Biallas: Currently, we have been working on different projects that will be brought up under New Business. I have also talked to Dr. Champagne recently, I will be also bring this up in New Business.
- Executive Assistant: Evelyn Briscoe: This week I have been working on planning a retreat for all of the orgs and their members. I have spoken with CLCE about helping with certain aspects of the event. I had a meeting with Phil (CLCE) today and spoke about how to go about doing activities relative to leadership. In terms of speakers, I currently have confirmation that Keith Champagne and Scott Drummond will be happy to host discussions or workshops relative to leadership and methods to proceed in improving each of our orgs. Hopefully, the retreat will be held the week before finals week or the first week in March. We have decided to combine the potluck and the retreat this quarter. I have gotten every org's partition board information aside from EQuAL and ABLE's information. Also, if you are wanting group pictures on the board, please take one at your next meeting and get it submitted to our office as soon as possible.
- Community Programmer: Olivia Durham: I have been working on trying to find a good science experiment that we can do with Adult

### **Org Reports:**

- ROTARACT- We are having the bake sale next week on the 20<sup>th</sup> 21<sup>st</sup> from 2:00-6:00pm. Anyone is welcome to join, we will be baking over 200 cookies in the SURC kitchen. Also, Munch Madness is still going on, unfortunately the small businesses that participated last year will not be this year; however, CWU will be participating, and we are looking for six more groups of students. There will be prizes and a championship trophy for the winner of the event. The event will be starting on February 27<sup>th</sup> and we will weigh in every Friday until the end of the quarter.
