## New Business:

- Wrap up Report for Rock Against Rape

The goal that the Wellness Center had for Rock Against Rape this year was to provide 250 people with the opportunity to learn information and participate with opportunities that educated them about these issues. Around 400 people ended up participating and only $\$ 4,906$ in total was spent, which is under budget. There were 25 booths that participated, where we also had an increase in student participation. We also had a student speaker share her story and experiences, which was received very well among the students. We were also pleased to have had the opportunity to reach out to the Yakima community, who also helped us with the event. $91 \%$ of attendees expressed interest in continuing the discussion about such topic, which is great! We would like to include more outreach opportunities her on campus regarding these issues, which includes the Clothesline Project. We were also interested

in potentially re-establishing VIP as an official organization through ESC. Lastly, there are left over t-shirts from Rock Against Rape, which are on sale in the Wellness Center. All of the money earned from these shirts will go directly back to ESC funds.

- ROTARACT Funds Request

From the 28-31 of May, ROTARACT will be sending 3-4 people to Canada to attend the RYLA Conference. The members who are going already have everything paid for, which comes out to about $\$ 600$ per person. We are seeking $\$ 600$ for funds for transportation. This conference will help ROTARACT members build their leadership skills, so we are excited about that!
