Also met with Andre to talk about some stuff and am working on a new project called Top Cats which will hopefully come out next week.





- 13.2 Jennie Blackson: April is Sexual Assault Awareness month. I would like to talk about sexual violence. These are National statistics. We tend to look at rape as an individual issue, not as a public health issue. I spent seven years working as a sexual assault advocate. We need to think about sexual assault as a crime. There are several studies that show 20 percent of those victims will never report it to police. 50 percent happen within the first three months of the academic year. 74 percent of rapes happen in university housing. So we are not without knowledge, power or will. What will we do? I talked to faculty senate. I want to ask you how we can have a campus coalition to end. I believe every student 90 showed there was a bystander that could have intervened. I ask you all to think about what you are going to do, I am sorry if this speech was a trigger and I hope you can all take care of yourself.
- 13.3 Brittany Kinsella: some students talked about Central Today and how it comes every day and how they do not read it. So I am going to look into that. Also the printers, I am looking into adding additional printers because some students are late to class because only a couple printers.
