8. NEW BUSINESS

- 10.1 Student Fees
 - Tutoring Services
 - Very limited in services to students
 - Don't have enough to pay for student staff
 - This is something students need
 - Minimum wage is going up next year so it is getting harder to pay more staff
 - This is something that helps students and gives the students a resource they need
 - Why do we have to pay these additional fees? Come to the student government office and we'll explain. These fees are separate from our tuition fees.

o SMACC

- Nationwide need
- Increased to \$15 or \$25 (would be the biggest student fee)
- Typically serve about 10% of the student population
- This is something that needs to be talked about
- Since the counseling center got an increase last year, they have been able to see more students, they want to be able to see all students and not turn away students, want more outreach programs for students, make sure students understand the importance
- These fees are on a quarterly basis so it would be \$75
- Want students to be the ones to vote on this
 - Important for student voices to be heard and be involved in what is being done with their money
 - SMACC is somewhat concerning since the space itself is small and need medical professionals
 - Fees will only grow as needs grow
- Student Union and Recreation Fee
 - Central is growing their numbers
 - Compensate for the increase in minimum wage
 - Important to keep that we have now that runs the SURC
 - Large portion is going back to students through student wages
 - Want to expand the SURC and add more services
