# Resolution on Wellness Space

Draft presented by the ASCWU President 1/26/2020

WHEREAS Gaudino spoke about the university's recent successes and the need to build on those successes in order to maintain momentum into the future. He reiterated Central's commitment to being welcoming and making student feel they belong. He established three university-wide goals one being to increase the first-year to second-year student retention rate from 71 percent to 80 percent over the next five years. To do this, he said the university must find new ways to create and sustain an environment where our students feel welcome and are supported by the institution and want to return to complete their degree programs and graduate.

WHEREAS in order to complete this goal students must have resources that support their overall wellbeing and wellness.

WHERAS the university states that the health and wellbeing of students is top priority, but students have no confidential space to discuss intimate partner violence, recovery, and mental health.

WHEREAS CWU Wellness center asked to be placed inside the new health education building because of intersectionality between missions, goals, and objectives was denied the only space available to serve CWU student appropriately

WHEREAS CWU Wellness Center works tirelessly to give its students culturally sensitive tools by promoting positive health behaviors, providing comprehensive advocacy and response, and collaborating to create a healthy campus community.

**BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED** that we, the Associated Students of Central Washington University, request that Central Washington University cease avoiding finding the CWU Wellness Center a space

**BE IT ALSO RESOLVED** that CWU Wellness Center be placed inside of the new health education building as requested by the student body countless of times but yet ignored

**BE IT ALSO RESOLVED** that if CWU cannot put CWU Wellness Center into the new health education building that a space will be provided and a topic of conversation until one arises

**BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** that CWU administration continue to work on finding the CWU Wellness Center an appropriate space for health promotion, advocacy, and recovery.

## **Resolution on Parking Issues**

Draft presented by the ASCWU VP for Student Life & Facilities 1/26/2020

WHEREAS in Central Washington University's 2019-2029 Capital Master Plan it states that in 2018 there were 4,456 parking stalls but approximately 5,546 parking permits were sold in the 2017-2018 academic year;

WHEREAS students who need accommodations for accessible parking are still required to purchase an on-campus parking permit;

WHERAS there is lack of free on-campus parking available to students who are not financially able to afford an on-campus parking permit;

WHEREAS the X-22 lot has not been maintained which can be unsafe for students who are utilizing the free lot;

WHEREAS there is not a parking lot solely dedicated to student who live on-campus to help open up space for students who live off-campus;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that we, the Associated Students of Central Washington University, request that Central Washington University case overselling the amount of parking passes than there is parking stalls;

**BE IT ALSO RESOLVED** that people with a physical handicap or impairment are not charged by CWU Police and Parking Service for parking in a parking stall dedicated to those with ADA needs:

**BE IT ALSO RESOLVED** that CWU Grounds and Maintenance maintain the X-22 lot to ensure students' safety;

**BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** that CWU Chief of Police and CWU VP of Operations work on solving these student issues regarding parking.
