MINUTES

Attending: Mark McClain, Armentia Tenner, Bob Trumpy, Jadon Berry, Pam Stoneburg, William Holmes, Scott Botten, Lynne Imamshah

Mark discussed the push to have an assessment required for any MIP, even the first, for a stay of prosecution. ADDS has a grant to provide free evaluations. Because of the extra time commitment for the assessment and follow up assessment recommendations, Mark said he is recommending reducing the community service component of sanctions from 40 hours to 16-20 hours. Discussion ensued regarding importance of “getting attention” of youth getting MIPs, how community service can be an asset in that regard, of the supervisory/paperwork burden of extensive community service, and the possibility of a compromise – reduce community service from 40 to 30 hours.

Recommendations from the committee were discussed:

1. Ensure that the police give reports to CWU even if a ticket is not issued when contact is made with a student
2. Have police officers consistently report probation violations (drinking) to the offender’s probation officer. Discussed the Spillman System database and its use for checking probation information when police respond to a call. Also WASIC information system – checks for warrants. If someone is on probation, could have it be part of the information system to contact the probation officer if there is a probation violation. William expressed his concern about ANY juvenile probation information getting into a database. Misdemeanant would be OK.

Discussed how MIP notification is handled in the public schools. As far as Scott knows, any notification goes to the principal; Scott does not get notification. Unclear as to how that information is then used. William confirmed that diversion notices for alcohol-related violations do go to the schools. Thus it should go to middle school principal as well. At the high school, referrals for alcohol/drug assessments are made from vice principal Ellersick. Need more information about how notifications are handled in the public schools.

The next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, June 8, 11 am, at the high school Counseling conference room. The agenda for the meeting will be to compare and contrast sanctions and consequences that are written up thus far.
