1. **Planning Committee report** - William Holmes reported on behalf of the Planning Committee, which has been meeting since November. The committee's charge was to develop objectives to accomplish identified goals. The committee discovered it needed to first clarify some of the goals approved by the Coalition. Nine original goals were reduced to seven by the Planning Committee, and William explained the rationale for each of the proposed changes. The Coalition approved the revised goals as presented by the committee.

Lynne Imamshah reviewed each proposed objective, showing how it related to a goal and key target area. Then Coalition members voted. They gave a green light to objectives they agreed with and flagged (or stopped) those with which they disagreed or had any questions, concerns, or comments.

The objective "to foster a social, academic & residential environment that supports healthy behavior," in support of goal # 7 (advocate, support and encourage positive community norms regarding underage and high-risk drinking) was unanimously approved. All the other objectives had at least one flag to stop approval. Comments on each of those will go back to the Planning Committee for further work.

2. **Short exercise** – Gail Farmer led the Coalition in an exercise to help them reconnect with their personal reasons for participating on the Coalition – heart, not head reasons – then concluded with asking members to sign up for a committee or interest area. 3. **"Senior Golf"** – This discussion was the beginning of a proactive collaboration among students, law enforcement, property owners, university officials, and community members regarding an end-of-the-year celebration that is lawful and peaceful and meets both students' and community needs.

Bob Trumpy presented a framework for looking at this issue, including structural, human resource, political and symbolic issues. Bob Richey then presented some background information and history of “senior golf.”

Derrick Peters, Vice President of the Associated Students of CWU Board of Directors, spoke on behalf of students. He said that their mission was to provide CWU students the opportunity to celebrate the growth and accomplishments of graduates through a safe, fun, and memorable event. He stressed the importance of the entire community working together to make this happen. He presented the idea of creating a senior appreciation event. This, he proposed, could take place at the fairgrounds and could include live entertainment, such as the Steve Miller Band, and a safe, contained, legal beer garden. He said that if the whole Ellensburg community, including CWU, is willing to work with the students on creating a senior appreciation event, this could be the solution to everyone’s “Senior Golf” problems.

Julie Williams, owner, Timothy Park Apartments, spoke regarding the concerns of property owners and their financial investment last year hiring private security guards to keep the students’ parties contained. The property owners are willing to contribute some financial support to an activity that is held downtown; but they are not willing to finance something that would only be in addition to, not in lieu of, senior golf.

Discussion ensued regarding the challenges ahead. Participants were asked to write down what they saw as the top three challenges to students’ carrying out their idea. The written challenges were collected and a sign up sheet for a Senior Golf Committee (membership list at end of minutes) was circulated. A meeting time will be coordinated and committee members will receive a compilation of the challenges articulated by participants.
