Admission Requirements

Students must apply and be accepted into the major prior to beginning 300- or 400-level courses in the CB. At the time of application, the 20 credits of pre-admission coursework should be substantially completed. Application forms are available in the department offices. The completed form must be accompanied by transcripts that reflect all prior college work. Admission shall be based on grades earned in the following courses:

A cumulative grade point average of 2.25 in the above courses must be achieved with a minimum grade of "C-" (1.70) in each course. The credit/no credit option will not be accepted for any of these courses. The applicant must have completed ENG 101/102 and achieved a minimum overall GPA of 2.25 in all collegiate studies. These criteria apply to equivalent courses transferred from other institutions. Students who have met all of the above requirements will be admitted unless the number of applicants exceeds available space. In that case, acceptance will be competitive, based on a selection index.
