

SP PEAB - 03/05/2004

Members present: Keith Mars, Cindy Jacobsen, Gene Johnson, Kristi Anderson, Eric Andreassen, Steve Gill, Bill Rasplica, Nicole Ayers, and Al Albertson.

The meeting was called to order.

1. Minutes: The minutes from the last meeting (01/16/2004) were read and approved.
2. Standards Review: The NASP standards have changed and Gene wishes to review the following standards:
 - a. Program context/structure (Standard 1.2). This standard involves the program responding to and supporting human diversity. Steve suggested that it should be reported that multicultural experiences are occurring for students during practica and internships. This includes evaluation of those student experiences by supervisors.
 - b. Field experiences/internship (Standard 3.1, 3.2, and 3.3). These relate to the standards for the practica and internships: 600 hours, supervised and collaborative, etc. Gene feels that these standards have been adequately addressed.
 - c. Performance-based program assessment and accountability (Standards 4.1, 4.2, and 4.3). It was suggested that Gene include specific items of evaluation procedures, etc that the PEAB has suggested.
3. Reevaluation: Gene asked whether legally students have to meet initial eligibility to remain in Special Education. There was much heated discussion regarding this, with Keith reporting that legally (according to Pam McPartland) students need to meet initial eligibility to reestablish a continuing disability.
4. All PEAB Meeting: This is scheduled for May 14th at 9:30 at the Grupe Center at CWU. Gene is asking Cindy to get lists of PEAB members from SU and UW. Gene reported that the grant money for the all PEAB meeting only covers mileage and food (which is provided at CWU by food services). The meeting will be a working meeting to further develop specific rubrics for the certification standards. There will also be some discussion about the new standards. The plan is to break up into 7 to 9 groups and work on specific standard (rubrics). It is hoped that a subcommittee will meet prior to the All PEAB meeting to refine and rough draft the rubrics. They may also meet after to finalize a rough draft of the partially developed rubrics. We will be working on both the Residency and Professional certificate rubrics.
5. Concerns regarding student assessments: Gene commented that there is some concern from CWU regarding how this occurs across all school psychology programs. It was pointed out that sessions are typically videotaped and that this is standard practice across all school psychology training programs in the state. All PEAB members were in agreement to this and must be standard practice.

The meeting was adjourned.
