1999, 2004	(1) Professional education advisory boards: The college or university, in compliance with the provisions of WAC 181-78A-250, has established and maintained a professional education advisory board to participate in and cooperate with the college or university on decisions related to the development, implementation, and revision of each preparation program -- i.e., teacher, administrator, school counselor, school psychologist, and school social workers. (Evidence is provided in response to 8 substandards)
2000, 2005	(2) Accountability: Each college or university, in compliance with the provision of WAC 181-78A-255, has established a performance-based preparation program. (Evidence is provided in response to 5 substandards)
2001, 2006	(3) Unit governance and resources: A separate college, school, department, or other administrative unit within the college or university, in compliance with the provision of WAC 181-78A-261, is responsible for providing the resources needed to develop and maintain quality preparation programs. (Evidence is provided in response to 12 substandards)
2002, 2007	(4) Program design: Each college or university, in compliance with the provision of WAC 181-78A-264, is responsible for establishing a collaboratively developed approved preparation program that is based on a conceptual framework, current research and best practice that reflects the state's learning goals and essential academic learning requirements. (Evidence is provided in response to 10 substandards)
2003, (2008)	(5) Knowledge and skills: Each college or university, in compliance with the provision of WAC 181-78A-270, has established policies requiring all candidates for certification to know and demonstrate the content, pedagogical, and professional knowledge and skills required for the particular certificate and areas of endorsement, which reflect the state's learning goals and essential academic learning requirements, and are necessary to help all students learn. (Evidence is provided in response to 12 substandards)
