FRIENDS' ACTIVITIES

Since July, 2005 Friends have made cash donations of over \$4000 to the Friends of the Library endowment. The Board of Directors has set a goal of attaining \$100,000 for the Endowment Fund during the next two years. It welcomes all contributions, both large and small, as it works to achieve this goal.

Since fall quarter, the Library has purchased twenty-one books for the collection, the majority of them relating to Washington State and the Northwest.

During the last six months, thirty-four faculty, emeriti, students, friends and university staff have donated over 1100 books, both hard-and-soft-cover, over 500 journals, 79 VHS tapes, and several DVD's, CD's laser discs, cassettes and scores. Many of these contributions have been added to the Library collections. Where duplications exist, the contributions have been added to the store of materials available for the book sale in the fall.
