At the end of October, you will receive a special mailing that asks you to give generously to the Friends of the Brooks Library Endowment Fund. This appeal is unique; it is not our usual bi-annual solicitation for memberships and small gifts; and it is not likely to be repeated in the near future.

In this special appeal, you will be asked to match the \$30,000 in donations made by Jim and Lillian Brooks, their children, and several Friends who consider the library to be a vital element of Central Washington University. Most of you are aware that former university president and geography professor Brooks provided the inspiration for the Friends of the Library. His goal is to create a stable and sizeable endowment for the library that will generate significant annual earnings for the acquisition of library materials: books, recordings of all types, musical scores, electronic databases, reference materials.

The Friends' Board of Directors shares this goal. In 2006, it negotiated an agreement with the University's Foundation, whereby the earnings of the endowment fund will only be transferred to the Brooks Library after the fund reaches a total of \$100,000. Both the endowment and the earnings will increase over time, generating ever-increasing amounts for the library's acquisition budget.

Your generous response to this special appeal will help us to match the funds provided by the Brooks family and other Friends and to attain our goal. Please help us to maintain the quality of the Brooks Library both now and in the future.
