# 1st Six Weeks Programs

The first six weeks programs are designed to help students adjust to life on their own. Over the course of the “1st Six Weeks” a series of programs will be put on for the residents to attend. Students attending these programs will receive credit for them in their University 101 class. Each week has a theme with programs that relate to it.

“Healthy Minds, Good Times!” This program focuses on mental health issues college students face and services available to deal with those issues.

“Japan Goes Central” Gives students the opportunity to socialize with ninety-one freshmen students from Asia University in Tokyo, who are here studying abroad at Central for 5 months.

“Get a Better Buzz” is program put on by our Wildcat Wellness Center, which educates students on how to be responsible if they are tempted by alcohol.

“Student Conduct Connect Four: Beer, Bongs, Bullies and More” gives students a better understanding of consequences to violating residence hall policy, as well as their rights as a student.

“Taking off the Mask” using video recordings of current CWU students to have a frank discussion about the roles students take on in a society.

“Safer Sex 101” educates students on how to protect themselves from STIs and unintended pregnancy and the resources available to them on campus.

“Hot, Hot, Hot Happy Hour” encourages students to get involved on campus and in the Ellensburg community through the Don & Verna Duncan Civic Engagement Center.

“Mr. and Ms. Central” is the annual talent competition sponsored by RHA during Homecoming Week. This event is modeled after “America’s Got Talent.”
