ASSISTANTSHIPS AND FINANCIAL AID

Central Washington University offers a number of graduate assistantships during the academic year for beginning and continuing graduate students. Graduate assistantships are available in each of the departments at CWU that offer graduate programs. Approximately two-thirds of the University's graduate assistants teach. Others serve as research assistants, and a few perform university service functions.

Applicants must:

- 1) Be fully admitted to a master's degree program at the commencement of the contract period
- 2) Demonstrate a high level of professional and academic promise
- 3) Be recommended to the position by the department where the appointee would be assigned

Full time assistantships require 200 hours of service per quarter (approximately 20 hours per week) and enrollment in at least 10, but not more than 14, credit hours per quarter. Graduate assistants must also have a 3.0 GPA at admission as well as maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 each quarter. All appointments for graduate assistantships are made through a formal written contract letter from the Associate Vice President of Graduate Studies and Research.

Financial aid is also available through the University from federal and state funds for students demonstrating financial need. Applications for financial aid may be obtained from the Office of Financial Aid and should be submitted no later than March 1. Employment opportunities, both on and off campus, are typically available as well. Travel and research funds are available to Graduate Students on a competitive basis.
