- c. Mathematics: MATH 103, MATH 107 (4), MATH 171 (4), MATH 140 (4), MATH 171 (4), MATH 202 or MATH 210
- d. Reasoning: PHIL 201
- e. Foreign Language: 2 years high school or 1 year college
- f. Computing Fundamentals: CS 101 (4) or IT 101 (3) at CWU
