






## Editing your preferences on the PC computer

Some people have had problems with losing the dictionary on Write:OutLoud and between every word that is typed they get a message that reads something like “Dictionary not available”. The fix for this problem is not too complex—we simply must “trash” the preferences file. In the Macintosh you would go to the System Folder, find the Preferences folder and drag the WOL preferences to the trash can. The PC side is somewhat different. Here is how it is done.

1. Click on the Start button 2. Click on the Run Button	
3. Type <b>regedit</b> and press OK	
4. In the <b>Registry Editor</b> click on the + sign in front of <b>HKEY_Current_User</b> .	
5. Click on the + <b>Software</b> 6. Click on + <b>Don Johnston</b>	

<p>7. Right Click on the Write:OutLoud Folder</p> <p>8. Click on <u>D</u>elete and when you are asked to delete respond <u>Y</u>es.</p>	
<p>9. When you begin Write Out Loud the next time, it should start up with the Dictionary working and it will rebuild the preferences by itself.</p>
