## London, England

### Program Description

*London, Writing and Culture: An Introduction* is a course that will take place in four parts while on-site in London. Part one provides students with a historic overview of London and includes excursions such as a boat ride on the Thames to Greenwich, visits to the Museum of London, the remains of the Roman Wall, and the Tower of London.

Part two includes a study of London's financial sector with pertinent literary selections. It will include excursions to prominent financial institutions such as the Bank of England, the Stock Exchange, Westminster Abbey, and the Houses of Parliament.

Part three of the course will focus on Shakespeare, Virginia Woolf, and other writers such as T.S. Elliot. During this portion of the program students will visit Stratford Upon-Avon, view at least one play, and tour the Shakespeare properties. Back in London students will read selections by Virginia Woolf and explore Bloomsbury where Woolf and other members of the Bloomsbury Group lived.

The course ends with part four which is an exploration of London's role as the center of empire and includes a walking tour of the East End with a visit to a Mosque, a speaker on multiculturalism in London, and a visit to the British Museum.
