A vision statement

- inspires dreams

A mission statement

- inspires action and drives our daily choices
- the overarching objective of the university
- outlines what the university would have to do consistently and excellently to make the vision a reality
- describes what we are going to do and why we are going to do it, and maybe how we are going to do it
- describes where we are now and why we exist
