WHAT REMAINS THE SAME?

- ➤ KEEP YOUR PRE-COA RUN CONTROLS THE SAME to run June month-end Project ID reports in July, and close-of-year reports sometime around August, as well as ad-hoc reports for FY2015 and previous years
- > The process to run nVision reports will be the same
- > The familiar Activity, Summary, and Balance reports will still be relevant
- > The Multi ChartField reports will also be available and relevant

WHAT CHANGES?

- > You will need to build new run controls for new report versions before you run reports for FY2016
- > The Activity, Summary, and Balance reports can be Executive Level, Divisional, or Department focused
- > The Department Summary report will include the 17 new Goods & Services budget rollup categories
- > The Department Activity report will have a second worksheet with a pivot table of the raw data so that users can slice and dice their information as needed to get the full picture
- > There will be a revised Multi ChartField report available based on the new COA
- > A thorough understanding of the new Chart of Accounts will be needed to interpret your reports
 - Department Focused (new department numbers are six digits)
 - o Tracked by Fund (001 becomes 149; know your funds and applicable rules)
 - Projects and Components most granular data fields (only Grants and Capital Projects will have Project IDs)
