

- Chair of the Department of Accounting, Director of the Master of Professional Accountancy program, Central Washington University (September, 2007 2009). During Fall quarter 2007, I led the Department of Accounting faculty in the development of more explicit educational objectives for the B.S. in Accounting program and the Master of Professional Accountancy program in response to accreditation review comments. Based on the new objectives and assessment information, the Master of Professional Accountancy curriculum was changed significantly. I also led the development of program assessment plans and student learner outcomes assessment plans for both the B.S. and master's degree programs. I have also been helping the College of Business dean's office on AACSB International accreditation issues.
- MBA Program Director and Professor of Accounting, University of Southern Nevada (July, 2004 August, 2007). I had the rare and exciting opportunity to create and develop a new business school from scratch. While my title was MBA Program Director, I functioned in the capacity of a dean. I was totally responsible for all administrative functions of the business school. I reported to the Vice President for Academic Affairs and Program Planning. I served in this capacity and as a Professor of Accounting.
- Division Head for the Division of Business and Accountancy, Truman State University (July, 2000 June, 2004). Divisions are similar to colleges. A Division Head is equivalent to a Dean at other colleges. Beginning in 2005, Truman State University changed the designation Division Head to the title of Dean. In this position, I reported to the Vice President for Academic Affairs. I was responsible for 27 full-time faculty and approximately 1,000 majors and pre-majors. During this time I also served as Professor of Accounting.
- Chair of the Department of Accounting, Central Washington University (January, 1997 June, 2000). During this time, the Department of Accounting developed a new Master of Professional Accountancy degree program. It was approved by the university before I left the university and by the State shortly after I left the university.
