CWU's overall rubric ratings for the 2014/15 academic year were very close to the prior year. All ratings were within 0.1 points of the prior year and at or close to targets.

Hopefully the percent of programs submitting Annual Student Learning Outcome Assessment Reports will improve in future years. Even though the number of programs submitting reports dropped the number of student assessments increased from 4,054 for 2013/14 to 8,432 in 2014/15, a 109% increase.

CWU academic staff should step back and assess the process and look for ways to make it more efficient and provide feedback to departments quicker.
