# **2016 NATIONAL SURVEY OF STUDENT ENGAGEMENT**

## A COMPARISON OF RESPONSES BY SENIORS ENROLLED ONLINE vs. SENIORS ENROLLED ON-CAMPUS

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## I. ABSTRACT

Central Washington University (CWU) administered the National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE) during the spring quarter of 2016. This report compares responses made to NSSE questions by "online" students enrolled in online degree programs (all respondents were seniors) to "on-campus" or "F2F" seniors enrolled at the Ellensburg campus or at one of the centers.

#### **II. METHODOLOGY**

The NSSE survey was emailed to all CWU first year and senior students during the spring 2016 quarter. The invitation email was sent on 4/5/16, and the fourth reminder email was sent on 5/3/16. The survey response rate was 19% for on-campus senior students and 20% for online senior students. CWU's eight peers had a 16% response rate for first year students and a 20% response rate for seniors.

All students who responded to the survey received a 10% coupon on a purchase from the Wildcat Shop (either in Ellensburg or online). Thirty respondents were randomly selected for early Fall 2016 registration.

Enterprise Applications Services identified which students in the survey population were enrolled in online degree programs. Fifty two responses were from students enrolled online; all of those students were seniors. 370 responses were from seniors enrolled in "on-campus" or face-to-face (F2F) courses. This report condenses much of the text of question stems and leaves.

The comparisons use a statistic called "Cohen's h" to classify the "substantive difference" between the two groups (online or on-campus) as small, moderate (or medium), or large. Group difference indices "lend themselves nicely to categorical or experimental outcomes rather than continuous or correlational data." The sample of online response and survey response rates are small, therefore the samples may be biased. These results can be used to identify areas of further research. However, readers should not assume that CWU populations have the same characteristics as the following samples.

### **III. SUMMARY**

The following tables and charts compare responses of students enrolled in online degree programs to oncampus responses (students attending the Ellensburg campus or one of the centers). The NSSE question numbers are identified for each table. There were only five questions with large differences. The average responses for students enrolled on campus were higher on questions 1e. through 1f. (see Table 2). Questions 1e. through 1h. ask if the respondent worked with other students. Online students' average response was much lower. Is there some way for CWU to improve collaboration among online students? Question 1i. asked if a student gave a course presentation.

The differences for the remaining questions had small or medium effect sizes. This seems to indicate that students enrolled in online degree programs have similar engagement as students enrolled at a campus.
