Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) Renton Technical College and Central Washington University

The purpose of this agreement is to foster a spirit of collaboration between Renton Technical College (RTC) and Central Washington University (CWU). This agreement will facilitate qualified students in the Multi-Occupational Trades program at RTC in their application to, admission to, and completion of the Bachelor of Applied Science (BAS) in Information Technology and Administrative Management (ITAM) Project Management specialization at CWU.

Qualified student applicants must meet the minimum requirements of admission to CWU. CWU retains final and sole discretion over all admissions decisions hereunder.

Carpentry Trades Program (CARP)

Under this agreement the RTC program will provide a transcript for each entering student with the following shown as college-level credit:

The minimum requirements to enter the CWU BAS-ITAM program:

- 2.30 GPA or above.
- Official transcripts from all colleges/universities attended.

For students meeting all requirements to enter this major, CWU will:

- Waive the requirement for the first-year experience course for students on this pathway.
- Waive the foreign language requirement.

The BAS-ITAM will:

- Offer the Project Management specialization (See Appendix A)
- Apply the 14 credits of PLA transcribed by RTC as meeting the internship requirement in ITAM BAS. Nine (9) of these credits will be applied as directly equivalencies for RMT 379 and IT 490, and therefore count as upper division credit.
- Add IT 165 Seeing Through the Data (4 credits) to the list of ITAM-provided courses to meet the CWU quantitative reasoning gen ed requirement. Students will have to meet the prerequisite by testing or by taking a MATH 100-C equivalent course; the RTC course was determined to be equivalent to MATH 100A or B. The RTC MATH& 107 course was determined to be equivalent to MATH 101.
- Provide IT 300 ITAM Tools for transfer student success (1 credit) to support students transitioning to upper-division coursework.
- Provide ITAM courses in the FlexIT performance-based format. Students choosing this format
 must have all CWU general education requirements not offered by ITAM completed prior to
 beginning the FlexIT program.
- Offer additional elective courses in the FlexIT format as needed to ensure students have 180 total credits to graduate.

It is agreed upon and understood that each party has the right and responsibility to make changes to its curricula and enrollment standards to maintain its academic integrity and meet accreditation standards. Such changes, if any, will be communicated in writing between respective administrators as they occur.

This agreement will be in effect beginning October 2, 2020 and may be renewed by mutual consent of the two institutions. The agreement will be re-evaluated every two years. Either partner may terminate this agreement upon 90 days' written notice to the other partner.
