Central Washington University (CWU) and Yakima Valley College hereby establish an articulation agreement leading to a Bachelor of Arts degree in Law and Justice. The degree will be conferred by CWU.

This agreement will begin in the 2024-2025 academic year. The parties to this agreement commit to offering this program until dissolved by mutual agreement. An evaluation of the program will be conducted every three years.

Students from Yakima Valley College will earn the Associate of Applied Science Transfer in Criminal Justice (AAS-T in CJ) and will be used for admission to the Bachelor of Arts degree in Law and Justice; students must also fill out the major application as specified in the admission requirements. Students must satisfy the General Education and foreign language requirements at CWU. Courses being transferred must have a grade of C- or higher in order to be utilized in the articulation agreement.

Upon completion of the program courses as shown in **Exhibit A** and the meeting of all graduation requirements a Bachelor of Arts degree in Law and Justice will be awarded. Students must complete a minimum of 45 credits at CWU, 68 credits of upper division credits (300/400), a minimum total of 180 credits, achieve a cumulative grade-point average (GPA) of at least 2.0 in courses taken at CWU. Students must also have achieved a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.25 in the major and 2.00 in the minor field of study. All courses fulfilling the major and minor requirements, including courses accepted in transfer, are used in computing the major and minor grade point average. **Exhibit B** provides associate degree requirements and its equivalencies

Tuition will be billed to each student at CWU's prevailing cost-per-credit rate for all courses.

Admission requirements for CWU are as follows:

- 1) Completed CWU Application for Admission (application can be found at <https://www.cwu.edu/admissions/apply?ref=1>)
- 2) A non-refundable \$60 application fee is required. Students submitting an application online must pay by using a credit (Visa or Mastercard) or debit card. Your application will not be processed until your \$60 application fee has been paid. Please follow the instructions at the end of the online application carefully.
- 3) Students transferring to CWU with the AAS in CJ must have a minimum cumulative transferable grade point average of 2.0 from all colleges or universities previously attended.

All enrolled students are eligible to apply for financial aid at CWU. Each student's situation will be evaluated on an individual basis. Students must apply for financial assistance through CWU's Financial Aid Office.




