The CWU Pep Band performed for most of the men's and women's home basketball games. There were 74 members in the ensemble, and they performed for 13 games and 2 rehearsals. A graduate student directed the ensemble. Students were paid \$25 per service, and 30\$ for the instrumental rhythm sections that required more time for set up and breakdown. There were two rehearsals and the students were paid \$25/\$30 per attendee. Overall, the performances and rehearsals of the CWU Pep Band cost \$17,270. Other costs include upgrades for equipment and supplies, with a portion reimbursed via S&A supplemental funding. Expenditures consist of the stipend for student participants, a graduate student directs the ensemble and supplies consists of matching Pep Band attire, items that help set up and breakdown of instruments, and transportation of equipment.

2. What was your fund balance at the end of the year? If positive or negative, please provide a detail explanation.

Our fund balance did not accurately reflect what we had remaining due to a capital asset error that inflated our fund balance by over 20,000. Our actual beginning balance did not reflect this but was in the neighborhood of 3,000 remaining in our account once the error was resolved.

We encourage all of our student groups to fundraise, this helps with their meal expenses when traveling. We also encourage them to apply for SAS and Club Senate funding.
