Equity Services Council is made up of eight student organizations: Access, Belonging, Learning, Equality (ABLE); Black Student Union (BSU); Equality Through Queers and Allies (EQuAl); Filipino American Student Association (FASA); First Generation Student Organization (FGSO); Movimiento Estudiantil Chicano/a de Aztlan (MEChA); Native American Student Association (NASA); and Violence Intervention and Prevention (VIP). Throughout the year, these eight organizations provided many programs that celebrated cultures and fostered identity development, education and pride in a diverse student body. Programs in FY12 included Showtime at McConnell during Black History Month; Native American Student Recruitment Weekend; Pride Week; Polynesian Luau; Ask an Indian forums; A Night with the United Farmworkers; Cinco de Mayo celebration; Earth Day cultural performances; and many smaller residence hall programs and educational workshops. Participation in these events varies from a small group (i.e., 15-20) in res halls to 200 people at Cinco de Mayo to nearly 1,000 audience members at the annual Drag Show during Pride Week. About half of the student organizations also used ESC funding to attending regional and national conferences for their larger associated organizations (i.e., the MEChA National Conference in Phoenix and the Northwest FASA Alliance conference at UW) allowing students to develop professionally and build their recruitment, retention and organizational skills to the benefit of all the orgs and the larger student body at CWU.
