The Pep Band provides university students with the opportunity to be involved in music while collaborating with and supporting other university students (student athletes and fellow participants).

The Pep Band serves as a spirit leader and musical ambassador for the men's and women's basketball teams during the winter quarter. There is an intersection with the marching band. Many students who participate in pep band have also been members of the marching band (although not required). Membership is open to all university students regardless of major.

The pep band supports and collaborates with university athletics to increase student participation and engagement with athletic events (basketball).

Participation in pep band aligns directly with the university's new vision of being a model learning community of equity and belonging. We take pride in offering membership to all interested students. The proposed deductions from FY22 would impact the payment allocation for student participants. Reduction of funds would decrease the amount of student/university events the ensemble would be able to participate (men's/women's basketball/ university events).

10. Are there any circumstances or challenges that are currently impacting your ability to use your base funding allocation this year?

There is construction currently taking place on Nicholson Pavilion. Due to this construction, the "home games" (which the ensemble performs on campus) have had to be relocated. Our current budget model does not include travel to these events (some as far as Moses Lake). This will reduce the ensemble overall participation thus, not allowing us to use all allotted funds for FY23

11. What growth or increases would you like to see in your program in the future?

We will continue to strive for an ensemble of up to 48 members and would like to hire a music librarian to assist with needs as well as provide funds for undergraduate/graduate student leadership positions to assist the director of bands in the operation of the ensemble.
