#### Call to order

The meeting was called to order at: 2:02 pm by Calisa Cruse. An attendance sheet was circulated.

## CAPS+ to support \$100k request from last meeting – Robert Kempel

Purpose of CAPS+ - to develop an online mobile first academic planning tool in house. He shared the usage numbers and phases of enhancements including Gen Ed update requirements. Asking for one FT ITS 3 position, 2-year commitment. Will provide regular updates to STFC. Discussion of hiring a FT staff vs CS students. What if they fund for a 1-year position to complete the Gen Ed inclusion and then hire CS students thereafter? Some departments like Anthropology are discouraged from using CAPS+. Question is asked if we can make the system work for every major/minor program eventually?

STFC members want the funding request to reflect the ask of a full-time staff person and for how long to show what exact total amount is being asked for. The request asks for 2 students for \$100k but the in-person request was different. Re-submit the funding request and provide any backup solutions to a 1-year funding and thereafter use Computer Science students. Bea is to email them asking for the 1-year funding request. In the course of that year, find a student solution to have IT/CS students work on this after the 1-year contract. If they can't find a good student solution, make a second request renewal with a cost breakdown of exact spending. It is felt that \$100k is more than an ITS3 position earns with benefits.

#### Campus Bird funding request \$46,700 – Lola Gallagher

Cost breakdown, quote from last summer. Could increase but doubt it will be much. Includes 3D maps of campus and a virtual tour. Once the materials are created, they belong to us. Public Affairs will pay the annual licensing fees. This is a startup cost. Interactive maps using GPS, mobile friendly. Topic maps, like Commencement. Interiors of buildings can be shown. This could include physical kiosks within buildings as well,

way-finding. Discussion and questions. \$30k is the entry point for this product but \$46,700 will include extras for a robust product.

MOTION: Fund the full amount of \$46,700 to purchase and implement CampusBird.
