



Aviation Professional Pilot Program Flight Training Fees

Embarking on your journey to become a pilot is an exciting and rewarding endeavor—and we're here to support you every step of the way. As you begin your flight training, it's important to understand how training costs are structured and what steps are required before you take to the skies.

Flight training fees are separate from standard university tuition and fees. These costs are divided into **course fees** and **lab fees** and are specific to enrollment in the Aviation Professional Pilot Program. Core courses will be conducted under FAA Part 141.

Before you can begin any flight activities, all course and lab fees must be confirmed as paid or pending on your Student Account.

This may require you to work with other departments, including Financial Aid and the Veterans Center.

CWU provides financial aid through the FAFSA, private lenders, as well as benefits under VA Education Benefits to help cover flight training costs. See your MyCWU To-Do list for more information.

The full process, including how to apply for financial aid or other benefits toward these fees, is explained in detail at cwu.edu/financial-aid.

We're committed to making this process as smooth as possible and are here to support you along the way.

COURSE FEES AND LAB FEES DEFINED

Course fee: A non-refundable charge that supports program overhead, including Ground instruction, facilities, insurance, staffing, and essential services necessary for safe and effective flight operations. Course fees are non-refundable. **Lab fee:** Covers flight and simulator lessons based on the quoted number of hours listed in the tables below.

Refund policy after lab completion:

At the end of each flight lab series/rating, any unused lab fees after the completion of a FAA Practical Test (Checkride) may be refunded to the student's CWU Student Account.*

Refund policy after lab/program withdrawal or discontinuation:

If a student withdraws or is discontinued from a flight lab, unused lab fees may be refunded back to the student's CWU Student Account.*

**The recipient/destination of the refund is dependent on the terms and conditions of the student's financial assistance funding source.*

- Private Pilot lab hours are based on the average number of hours students typically require to complete the lab.
- Lab hours for the Instrument, Commercial, Multi-engine, and CFI labs are based on the syllabus minimums required for lab completion.

Financial Holds and Overages

Step-by-Step Process

1. MONITOR YOUR LAB FEE BALANCE

- Regularly check your balance in Flight Schedule Pro.
- It is your responsibility to track your available funds to avoid interruptions in your training.

2. WATCH FOR LOW BALANCE WARNING

- An email notification will be sent to your CWU email when your remaining balance is \$700 or less.
- This is your early alert to plan ahead and deposit additional funds before you are restricted from scheduling.
- As a reminder, federal and veteran aid cannot be used to pay for overages.

3. CEASE FLIGHT OPERATIONS WHEN FUNDS ARE DEPLETED

- Once your lab fee funds are fully used, a financial hold will be placed on your flight account.
- You will not be permitted to schedule or dispatch any:
 - Flights
 - Simulators
 - Ground instructions
- You must deposit additional funds before resuming any training activity.

4. DEPOSIT ADDITIONAL FUNDS

- Meet with your flight instructor to determine an estimate of the funds needed to complete your lab.
- Email Aviation@cwu.edu and copy your flight instructor to request the estimate to be placed on your CWU Student Account.
- Pay these funds in your MyCWU Student Account, and email to release your hold.
- For estimates, refer to the posted overage resource hourly rates (see table).
- Funds must be deposited before any further training is allowed.

5. RESUME TRAINING

- Once the agreed-upon amount has been paid, you can be scheduled and dispatched for flights, simulators, and ground instruction.
- You may then continue training without further delay.

NOTE:

- Any unused overage funds will be refunded to the student's CWU Student Account upon completion or withdrawal from the associated course.
- Alternatively, students may request unused overage funds to be carried forward in the flight school scheduling software and applied toward future flight training.
- Overage charges are not covered under FAFSA or VA Education Benefits and must be paid separately.

ADDITIONAL STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

Students are responsible for paying separately for:

- FAA Medical Certificates
- FAA Written Exams Fees
- FAA Practical Tests (Checkrides) Fees

Each flight course includes 2 hours of aircraft rental time for the checkride.

Payment to the Designated Pilot Examiner (DPE) is made directly by the student. Financial Aid may be available to cover costs.

- ForeFlight subscription (instrument training only)
