

English Language & Literature Major

The Language and Literature program has recently revised our major to add a practicum requirement to help prepare students for their professional careers. If you declared the major **before Fall 2024**, you may continue with the previous major requirements. Students declaring in **Fall 2024 and after** will follow the new requirements listed below.

The English Language and Literature Major will broaden your knowledge of literary history and traditions, develop your understanding of different cultures, and introduce you to the world's most brilliant writers. Our inclusive curriculum offers a diverse selection of courses that cross national borders, literary genres, and minoritized cultures. This degree will prepare you with essential skills in persuasive communication, analytical reasoning, creative thinking, and emotional intelligence that are most in demand by employers in a variety of professional fields, including teaching, training, writing, publishing law, research, business, and government.

Our faculty is comprised of excellent teacher-scholars who genuinely care about you, the student. We actively publish and present scholarship at conferences on topics ranging from maritime monsters in Shakespeare to current portraits of the US borderlands, as well as editing for publications like the *Journal of Intercultural Studies* and the *International Journal of Undergraduate Research and Creative Activities*. We have unique strengths in transpacific and transatlantic literatures, gender and sexuality studies, and ethnic studies that help us connect our courses to real-world issues. Further, we closely mentor students in research, writing, career professionalization, and preparation for graduate study.

- Demonstrate knowledge of the range of literary perspectives, conventions, and forms.
- Understand and be able to articulate orally and in writing how literature is contextualized culturally.
- Demonstrate their writing competence by successfully meeting the rhetorical needs of situations requiring the application of a variety of genres and styles.
- Demonstrate knowledge of literary critical theories.
- Demonstrate proficiency in research methodologies
- Demonstrate a functional knowledge of grammar and linguistics

Plan to take ENG 302 and ENG 303 your first quarter because they are pre-requisites for most upper-division literature courses. Take ENG 320 (English Grammar) early in your program because it will help you with written assignments.
